### **Monthly Project Update – July 2010**

#### **Recently launched 'Water-Smart Gardening in Santa Cruz County' Website promotes outdoor water efficiency**

A new on-line gardening database was recently launched in June 2010 as an easy-to-use resource for creating water-saving gardens in Santa Cruz County. This website is full of inspirational gardens and ideas that can help reduce summer watering. It features local plants especially suited for Santa Cruz County climate. The creation of this database began as a joint effort by the City of Santa Cruz, the City of Watsonville, Soquel Creek Water District, San Lorenzo Valley Water District, Scotts Valley Water District and the Monterey Bay Master Gardeners when the County was entering its third year of drought. Although the region experienced normal rainfall levels last year, a low water-use garden can tolerate a future dry spell far better than those that require more water and may suffer during periods when water-use is restricted.
